SPRING GARDEN TIPS FROM KC LANDSCAPING

 Δ Hopefully the rain will be coming in October, so to prepare and keep your garden looking good in the springtime through into summer, it's a good idea to compost beds now and top dress lawn.

 Δ Watering your garden is essential at this time too.

 Δ Cut grass very short spike the lawn so the organics can infiltrate properly and top dress

 Δ Water your garden every second day ... and do a rain dance.

 Δ As far as planting goes ... plant indigenous water wise plants, especially succulents because they are low maintenance and look good all the time.

 Δ Seedlings are fine for small pots to spruce them up but they are thirsty! Most nurseries have a good selection or you can order from me (Karen Cox).

 Δ Currently it's a good time to prune your trees get rid of dead wood and tidy up your plants in beds turn the soil compost , split and water, to prepare for the upcoming seasons.

 Δ We are busy with a long term plan to renovate all the verges in chartwelL, we are just working around the water challenge we have at this point.

 Δ A new bed has been prepared on the corner of Runnymead and Third Road and we are looking for succulents and rocks to be donated please.

 Δ We will collect if anyone has, as well as any indigenous plants to add to our beds in the Neighbourhood.

 Δ I have also challenged Chartwell to take out one non indigenous tree in your garden and plant an evergreen indigenous tree. Some examples are :

Δ Syringa ... poisonous berries

 Δ Blue gum suck up vast amounts of groundwater Δ Black Wattle which competes with indigenous trees and dominates the grasslands

Δ Replace with:

Δ Wild Olive

Δ Wild Elder

Δ Ilex Mitis

All of these trees can be bought and planted by us if you like.

Aunty Maureen 'THE CHARTWELL UPCYCLED' tells: BIN PROJECT'

Part of the new CCE boards vision is to clean up and beautify the streets of Chartwell. Litter on our streets is a constant struggle that we face. Whilst the Estate Management team picks up litter on a weekly basis the streets are only clean for a day or two. It was decided that if we install a bin at every intersection, hopefully the streets will be clean everyday. The idea of the 'Chatwell Upcycled Bin Project' was brought to the CCE Board by long time resident Julian Walker, who has always been passionate about preserving Chartwells environment. He said "I believe that unless we supply bins, there will never be a change to the ongoing litter issue. It's about education."

The Bin Project aims to help the environment by keeping it clean through discouraging littering in the Chartwell area. These bins don't only help the environment by reducing litter, they are also mainly made out of upcycled materials. The body of the bins are made from polypropylene sewer pipe offcuts, collected from the Joburg Water sewer upgrade project, and the stand consists of 2 gumpoles.

The goal is to ultimately have a bin at every major intersection in Chartwell. The first phase we are aiming at is 15 bins. Discussions are currently being held between the CCE and the Sweepstakes about the sponsorship of this project. As these bins will be positioned on our verges, the hope is that the recyclers will empty the bins for us. Yes, thats it a "Self Emptying Bin". This will be a community project and we will ask for the input of all residents when the time is right.

CHARTWELL ACHIEVER Lorette Knowles-Taylor - Chartwells showjumping star

Lorette Knowles-Taylor is a long time Chartwell resident whose passion is show jumping. Lorette is a decorated South African show jumper who has achieved incredible things throughout her career. We spoke to Lorette to find out more about her and how she got to where she is today.

QU: How long have you been living in Chartwell? ANS: Since 1999. My mom-in-laws property which she bought in 1981 was the last (middle) property to be bought up by the group that developed what we now know as the Broadacres Shopping Centre.

QU: Which disciplines do you do? And what is involved with them?

ANS: I am a showjumper. This is where you and your horse jump over a set of fences and obstacles in an arena, designed by a course designer.

QU: How long have you been doing show jumping for? **ANS:** I have ridden since I was 7 and competed since I was 9.

QU: What got you into horse riding and showjumping? ANS: My Dad took me on a ride in the mountains in the Drakensberg one family holiday when I was 7.

QU: Have you always been passionate about riding? ANS: Absolutely mad about riding and horses since that first holiday ride.

QU: What are some of your top achievements in the sport? ANS: Receiving Protea colours, ranking no 1 in SA and winning the SA Derby would rank as my personal top achievements thus far.

QU: A bit about your family and what you like to do when you are not on your horse.

ANS: Barry, my husband is also a protea showjumper and I have a 14 year old daughter who rides competitively too, Ashlee. I have 2 step daughters, Lexi and Danah, who are now married and have since moved out of Chartwell. And we have 3 grandsons from our eldest. Lexi. Nicolas is 18 months and the twins Leo and Lex were born in March this year. When our family isn't working or at a horse show we try and get away from the business- we love the Bush and especially the Kruger.

QU: Do you teach showjumping or horse riding?

ANS: Our showjumping stable yard is called Farnham Stables. We specialize in high performance showjumping coaching of ages from 14 years. I am involved with the juniors- from 14 to 18 years old (our sister yard is in Kyalami and produces our pony riders and then they come across to me for their junior careers). Barry is responsible for coaching the young riders and adults.
