Spring is here, Christmas is coming, and as we all know, this unfortunately means that the criminals are sure to be coming out of hibernation. As always we would like to remind and encourage new ones where necessary. every resident to be on high alert and take all necessary security precautions. Remember that a secure area starts with every resident taking ownership of Mend and/or monitor any non-electric securing themselves and their property. Please take time to do a full security audit of your property.

Spring security checklist:

Check your alarms, beams and cameras Discuss and agree on an emergency are working.

Check all lights are working and install Cut any long grass.

Ensure that your property is clearly numbered for easy identification by security reaction personal.

CRIME TIPS ON HIJACKINGS

- Always pay attention to who or what is in your immediate vicinity
- Lock your doors and close your windows before driving off
- Keep your valuables hidden from sight by locking them in the boot of your car or stowing them behind your
- If you think you are being followed or notice something unusual near the entrance of your home, don't drive in.
- Take your keys out of the ignition before climbing out of your car to open gates.
- If you are in a vehicle incident and don't feel comfortable with the situation, drive to the nearest police station for help.
- Ask someone to meet you at your gate or door if you are going to arrive home at irregular hours.

The licence plate recognition cameras have been erected and are operational at the three entry exit points of the area. This means that any stolen, wanted or 'flagged' vehicle that enters our area is located and followed by the ADT response vehicle. The protocol is that ADT contact SAPS immediately and follow the vehicle until they either leave the area or SAPS arrives to make an arrest. The overview surveillance cameras will be installed once we reach the 100 contributing residents required.

We are in the process of formulating a sustainable security solution for the river, we will be holding a meeting for all river property owners on the 10th of September. Please diarize this date and be sure not to miss it.

ADT have been very active on patrol with a dedicated night time vehicle. We still need a further 12 residents signed up with ADT before we get a completely dedicated ADT vehicle in the area. For us to get the maximum benefit from the CCTV camera system, it is critical that we reach the required number of ADT subscribers in the area.

As spring approaches Chartwell begins to transform as the dry brown landscape starts turning green.

For residents it's the month to prepare gardens and to keep an eye out for veld fires as we wait for the first rains to cleanse the dust. We ask that residents please remember to give some water to the trees on your verges during this time. The re-appointed board has been liaising with Karen Cox of KC landscaping regarding the plan to tidy up our neighbourhood. Having cut a number of verges, cleared fire breaks and the area around the grave site they have now started work on the entrance gardens.

From there they will move onto a number of initiatives including the revitalising other corner gardens. The CCE will be liaising with local businesses who wish to be involved and gain exposure to the community.


Focus is being made to improve 1st road, particularly addressing the area by the open Calgro land opposite Cedar Creek and where Seven Oaks joins with Longleat. Through cooperating with Johannesburg Water as they complete their project a new look will be left to this area which has been in the past neglected or affected by illegal dumping.

CEDAR ROAD HEDGE

A new project that the Sweepstakes are considering is to introduce is an indigenous hedge along the Cedar road perimeter wall. This aims to provide both security and beautification of a wall that has clearly aged over the years. The sweepstakes team, along with the CCE and the conservancy will work to identify the right tree and thorny bush types for this initiative.


CHARTWELL SOCIAL EVENTS

Chartwell is filled with amazing people, with so many different skills, interests, talents, abilities and personalities. As a community we should all be incredibly proud of our young Chartwell Achiever, Scott Billet (23), who is out there building a huge name for himself on the FMX (Freestyle Motocross) circuit. We spoke to Scott, who incidently is a regular member of our blockwatch team, and this is what he had to say;

QU: What exactly is involved with FMX? **ANS:** Freestyle Motocross is all about having fun and expressing yourself as a rider. It is far less competitive than Motocross racing especially in our country where there's only a hand full of people who do FMX professionally. The aim is to learn as many tricks as possible (Superman's, Seat Grabs and other variations that involve letting go of the motorcycle mid air). One of the best and hardest tricks to learn is the backflip which I recently landed this past December.

QU: How long have you been doing FMX?

ANS: I have been doing FMX professionally for 6 years now but I started jumping Rush FMX and all of the riders are very and trying small tricks 10 years ago when active on Social Media. We also travel I was 13 years old.

QU: What got you into it? ANS: My parents bought my older brother and sister a bike when I was 4

When I was 11 years old my father passed away and racing wasn't the same without him so I began riding with my good friend and teammate Dallan Goldman and that's how I was introduced into the Freestyle Motocross side of biking. QU: Have you always been passionate about riding? **ANS:** Since the day I first rode a bike

I have been absolutely in love. It is an adrenaline rush like no other and I could never imagine not being on a bike. Whether

I'm riding for fun with my friends or traveling around the country doing shows it is something I will never let go of and I will ride for as long as I'm able to!

QU: How did you get to ride for Dragon Energy?

ANS: I ride for a team called Jungle very often to do shows all over South Africa as well as up into Africa so when we approached Dragon Energy with our proposal they were more than excited to sign us on as an official Dragon Energy





FMX team.

QU: What are some of your top achievements?

ANS: This year I won King Of The Whip which is a contest to see who can turn their bike the most upside down and backwards and return for a safe landing. It consists of all the top riders in the country from both motocross and freestyle motocross. I was extremely happy to win this year as last year I was confident to place on the podium but had a crash and dislocated my collar bone. I gained a lot of TV, newspaper and radio coverage through that event and walked away with a R20 000 cash prize so it was awesome! Some other achievements have been mainly my personal goals such as riding with some of my biggest idols, traveling around Africa and just having fun doing what I love!

QU: What are your future plans?

ANS: My future plans are to continue progressing in the sport by learning new tricks. I also have plans on traveling overseas to expand my name in the sport and to meet and ride alongside some of the big international names in the industry.

So next time you hear the sound of a motor bike, just think it might be the next Scott Billet, a world champion in the making.

"We don't want an airport"!

That was in 1972 when it was first announced that a group of pilots were considering building Lanseria airport...

There is no need for another airport — Jan Smuts (as it was then) was large enough for all international flights, Rand Airport and Grand Central were close enough for any private planes... another airport would just be a nuisance and would spoil our quiet country life.

There was so much opposition to the whole idea that a group of young ladies, all in their bikinis, lay in front of the bulldozers as a publicity stunt to try and squash the proposed project.

But – the small airport was built and the only concession made to some of the adjoining farmers was that the runway was moved slightly from the original plan and a second smaller runway was added.

It was only a couple of years later, when the flight school started, that Lanseria Airport showed any signs of becoming a proper airport and private plans were watched with great interest as they did their aerobatics.

In the late 1970s when South Africa was sending troops to Angola, C130 Hercules planes (heavy cumbersome and noisy ones) flew over Chartwell almost every night with equipment and supplies for the army.

At that time, too, the N14 Krugers-dorp-Pretoria highway was built by Concor Construction and a wide grass centre strip was included in case of emergency landings.

Now 40 years later, we are so proud of Lanseria Airport with its comfortable departure lounge, good restaurant and spacious viewing deck and would rather choose to fly from there whenever possible.

Upgrades underway

The rising main upgrade has progressed along the Klien Jukskei to Craigavon / Waterford and on the Farmall bank to the pump station. Currently there has been a delay as the river crossing into Chartwell is being approved, and final arrangements with affected land owners being made. Johannesburg Water aims to complete the line before our first rains. This will be followed by the rehabilitation of the areas where trees and river banks have been affected. Joburg water will also carry out the bioremediation treatment of the river itself.

This upgrade addresses failures on the existing pipe which has caused sewage spills into our section of river and is part of additional upgrades to the Zandspruit pump station that are underway.

Local water infrastructure upgrade

The replacement of local water pipes supplying our properties and new fire hydrant points is continuing in various parts of Chartwell. Please report any leaks in this system which are easier to see during the dry period. Water supply issues


After a challenging 8 days for some residents without water, the mains supply pipe to the area was finally repaired. It was heartwarming to see how Chartwell neighbours, at a time of need co-operated by opening their doors and businesses to allow people to shower or access their borehole

During this tense period a number of meetings were held with the neighbouring estates also affected. The result was the formation of a task team consisting of an independent expert as well as representatives from each affected estate, CCE included. Whilst a strong message was needed to be delivered to JW, as opposed to using legal means the approach decided on, was to convene a meeting with the Joburg Water MMC Nico de Jager along with the MD, the chief operations manager, senior engineer and project

Together they presented a clear plan with available budget that has been in progress since 2017 to now upgrade a 3km section of pipe that flows from the Olivedale reservoir into and across Chartwell. The project has been approved and will commence immediately lasting for a period of approximately 9 months.

We are also working on improving number of locations of emergency water tanks in times of need approach to how the water is switched on and off. A Facebook page has been created which will be used to


